## **MATHS**

### SCIENCE

This week our focus is on habitats. What is a habitat? That's right it's the natural type of place an animal lives in. This week I'd like you to watch this clip

# **ENGLISH**

This week, I would like you to complete some activities based on Chapter 2 of Emery the Explorer – A Jungle Adventure.

- 1. Write a description of Dex D Saster. Use the clues the author has given in the first two chapters of the story to help, but make sure that you use your own words and lots of strong adjectives. Clues: He is 'trouble with a capital T'. He is a villain. He is Emery's biggest rival and does his best to ruin Emery's adventures. He calls Spider a 'stupid pet'. He guffaws when he is about to cut the ropes on the bridge. You can write about what he might look like and also about his characteristics and personality. When you have finished the description, draw a picture of Dex to go with it. Add a speech bubble and think of something that you think Dex might say.
- 2. In the story, Spider and the other monkeys in the jungle call out to one other. Imagine that the monkeys can speak. What might they be saying to one another? Write a short conversation between Spider and the monkeys. If you can, use speech marks and the correct punctuation in your dialogue.
- 3. Write the first paragraph of Chapter 3 for the author. Pretend that the readers have chosen option three and that Emery and Spider are going to jump into the water below them to escape from Dex. Make your writing as dramatic and as exciting as possible and use lots of interesting language. Add some speech if you can.

If you are enjoying this story, there is another Emery the Explorer book on Fiction Express that you could try – it's an underwater adventure.
