ENGLISH

This week, please complete these activities based on Chapter 4 of Emery the Explorer – A Jungle Adventure.

- 1.Emery has to choose between three caves at the end of the chapter. Write a paragraph to describe each of the three caves. Remember that each cave has a different name. The author has given the caves these names to help you to build a picture of them in your mind. Think about what the caves might look like. How do they smell? Are they dry or damp? Is it light or dark inside them? What things might Emery and Spider see in each of the caves? Try to make all the descriptions as different from each other as possible. When you have finished the descriptions, write a sentence to say which of the caves you would choose to go into and why.
- 2. Imagine that you are an explorer who has an encounter with a dangerous animal in the jungle. This could be a crocodile, like Emery and Spider, or a different sort of jungle animal. Write a short story about your near miss with danger. What sort of animal was it? What happened exactly? How did you escape from the animal? How did you feel? Make your story as exciting as possible for all your readers!
- 3. See resources sheet for this week on some punctuation practise based on sentences from chapter 4. There's also a sheet for practising your joined handwriting.

Remember after you read any books, look on Accelerated Reader to see if there is a quiz you can complete.

TOPIC:

Make a collage of a piranha fish. Cut out the shape of a fish and use different materials to stick onto your fish to decorate it. Don't forget to add some fins, some beady eyes and some sharp teeth!

Emery will need to eat well on his adventure. Can you remember which foods we need to eat to stay healthy? Have a look at the eatwell plate on the resources document. Then with your adult, read the rules for food hygiene and the safe preparation skills. With your adult choose a recipe and have a go at preparing a salad. <u>Adults – please</u> <u>ensure you supervise your child at all times with this activity.</u> Why not take a photo of your completed salad and send it to me – then I can share it on our website so your friends can see what you have been doing.
