Geography

The focus will be South America. We will also look at rainforests.

- drawing inferences such as inferring characters' feelings, thoughts and motives from their actions, and justifying inferences with evidence
- predicting what might happen from details stated and implied
- identifying how language, structure and presentation contribute to meaning

Writing

- continue to distinguish between homophones
- use dictionaries to check the spelling and meaning of words
- use a thesaurus
- selecting appropriate grammar and vocabulary, understanding how such choices can change and enhance meaning
- in narratives, describing settings, characters and atmosphere and integrating dialogue to convey character and advance the action
- proof-read for spelling and punctuation errors

Maths

This term we are aiming to:

- Multiply and divide whole numbers and those involving decimals by 10, 100 and 1,000
- Recall multiplication and division facts for multiplication tables up to 12 × 12
- Multiply multi-digit numbers by a one-digit number using formal written layout
- Calculate area and perimeter.
- Identify equivalent fractions, simplify fractions, add and subtract fractions, find common denominators, multiply and divide fractions by whole numbers, find fractions of amounts.
- Solve problems, including missing number problems, using number facts, place value, and more complex addition and subtraction
- Solve multi-step problems in contexts, deciding which operations and methods to use and why
- Draw and translate simple shapes on the coordinate plane, and reflect them in the axes
- Describe positions on the full coordinate grid (all 4 quadrants)
